Established in 1979, Cedar Valley Hospice is the expert provider of hospice care in Northeast Iowa. As a non-profit, we strive daily to carry out our mission and uphold the highest standards for our employees who help families manage advanced illnesses and symptoms wherever they reside or at our Hospice Home. We provide in-home care for all as part of our hospice and palliative care programs – regardless of age, diagnosis or ability to pay. Our other services include: the area's only Hospice Home, palliative care, adult and youth grief programs, and case management for people living with HIV.

In 1986, when the first cases of HIV infection were detected in Northeast Iowa, a group of concerned citizens began meeting in Waterloo and The AIDS Coalition of Northeast Iowa was formed.

In January of 1988, founding members realized the coalition's growth required the resources and infrastructure that could only be provided by an established institution. By March of 1988, the newly renamed, Cedar AIDS Support System (CASS) became part of Cedar Valley Hospice.

CASS provides free and confidential HIV case management for people living with HIV.

Case management

CASS is staffed by professional case managers who ensure the delivery of comprehensive, free case management and benefit coordination services.

CASS Case Managers tailor care plans for each client, helping them identify their medical and physical needs, define their goals and link them to appropriate on-site or off-site services. CASS serves

15 counties in Northeast lowa.

Additionally, case managers provide counseling to meet the psychosocial needs of clients and their families. This includes emotional support, health and risk-reduction education, and treatment-adherence counseling to ensure readiness for complex HIV treatments.

Information & referral

CASS has access to a variety of HIV information and resources. Case managers also work closely with local health care providers and community service organizations. The goal is to assist clients in finding medical and emotional care and also to increase the quality and consistency of financial and support services.

Anyone interested in obtaining information or making a referral can call 319.272.2437. Calls are confidential and welcome from those living with HIV, family members, significant others, students, friends and other interested persons.



Financial assistance

CASS has direct assistance programs that can offer:

- Grocery and basic needs gift cards
- Local bus passes
- Transportation reimbursement for out-of-town medical, dental and CASS visits
- Crisis or emergency expenses
- · Financial assistance with:
 - Rent, utilities, phone, eye glasses, etc.
 - Health insurance and medication co-pays, co-insurance and premiums

CASS Case Managers also work closely with local agencies and programs to find other available resources. Each program has its own eligibility rules, requirements and is dependent on available funding.

Benefit coordination

CASS Case Managers can also assist you with determining what the best health insurance options are to meet your medical needs.

Confidentiality

CASS understands the confidentiality concerns of many people with HIV and are familiar with the laws protecting HIV-related information. You will be asked at your first visit about your wishes related to sharing information with associated agencies and providers, and your wishes will be respected.
