Volunteer responsibilities

All volunteers are provided a 16-hour training and orientation (required by Medicare).

The information learned is valuable and useful as a volunteer in any capacity at Cedar Valley Hospice.

Multiple opportunities are available throughout the year to fulfill this requirement. An interview and background screening is also performed.

Patient/family volunteer responsibilities:

- Try to donate at least one hour a week
- Be in good physical and emotional health
- Be a sensitive and empathetic person
- Be a good listener
- Maintain confidentiality
- Be comfortable with varied spiritual beliefs and cultural backgrounds
- Function as sensitive listeners to a family after a death (grief support). This may include phone calls, home visits or accompanying family members to grief support groups or social events.

Friends Committee volunteer responsibilities:

- Share the story of Cedar Valley Hospice by being an ambassador in the community
- Participate in fundraising events & meetings
- Help gather silent auction items for events
- Support and encourage financial giving
- Assist in marketing activities as requested
- Attend training as necessary

Volunteer Opportunities

At Cedar Valley Hospice, there are a variety of volunteer opportunities.

Patient/family volunteer

These volunteers are companions on a hospice patient's journey so no one has to walk alone. They help them by *Making Each Moment Matter* through listening and responding to patient and family needs with understanding and empathy. Volunteers also help maintain a sense of normalcy and quality of life. Tasks may include:

- Providing companionship to patients
- Offering respite care for the caregiver
- Running errands
- Visiting the Hospice Home

Friends of Cedar Valley Hospice Committee volunteer



The Friends of Cedar Valley Hospice work with the Advancement team to educate the public about Cedar Valley Hospice and raise needed funding for hospice care and programming. This group meets once per month at the Waterloo Support Center to help plan/execute events.

Veteran volunteer

As a partner of the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization's "We Honor Veterans" program, we recognize a patient's military service. We are always looking to connect patients that are veterans with other veterans who can listen and support the patient throughout their journey.



Grief support volunteer

Grief cannot be fixed, it can only be witnessed and experienced.

Acknowledgment can be a powerful tool by providing support, validation, and education to those navigating their own grief journey.

Volunteers may be tasked with:

- Assembling grief mailings and other supportive educational information
- Serving as a sensitive and supportive listener to caregivers after a death (either in person or on the phone) while offering information about our support services
- Assisting the grief counselor with grief support groups, educational presentations or grief department events

Eucalyptus Tree volunteer

Youth grieve differently than adults. The Eucalyptus Tree Program helps youth who are grieving the death or terminal illness of someone special to them. Volunteers are key to the program's success and may help with:

- Participating in public appearances as Katie and Quincy Koala
- Assisting grieving youth with activities during a day camp held in the summer
- Supporting our youth grief coordinator during in person sessions, small groups, or educational presentations
